# Online Safety – Jessie and Friends: Online safety education for 4-7s

Children are accessing technology and the internet at a younger age than ever before. It's never too early to talk to your child about what they do online and who to tell if they come across anything online that makes them feel worried, scared or sad.





Jessie & Friends is a series of three animations that follow the adventures of Jessie, Tia and Mo as they begin to navigate the online world, watching videos, sharing pictures and playing games. There's also a storybook for each episode, to help you and your child keep the conversation going.

We use these animations and characters with the children in school when talking about online safety and teaching computing, so they will be familiar with them.

# Parent/Carer Feedback

Thank you to the families of Eastfield Infant & Nursery that have taken the time to complete our survey. We have been really pleased to hear that every parent/carer who completed the survey would recommend Eastfield to another parent/carer and equally felt that their children were safe and happy at our school.

As always, we are keen to know what we are getting right for our school community and what we could do to be even better. There were some parent/carers that were unsure of a couple of things that we do here at Eastfield and what we promote, so I wanted to take the opportunity to clarify some of those points:

#### What my child is learning...

Some parent/carers were unsure what their children are learning at school. If you find yourself in this position, please do refer to the following forms of communication that we send out and are available on our school website. Parent/Carer briefings – these are emailed out at the start of every half term for every year group to inform you what your child will be learning for the next 6/7/8 weeks. Once emailed out, they are uploaded onto the school website in the <u>"our classes" section</u>.

**Weekly notifications** – Nursery and Reception have weekly overviews of their learning that are emailed out by the school office. If you are not receiving these then please contact Mrs Unwin for your contact details to be checked. **Curriculum at Eastfield** – our school website holds all the information you need to know about all subject areas covered across all year groups. This can be found in the <u>"teaching and learning" section</u> of the school website.

#### High expectations for children...

Several parent/carers seemed unsure whether the school has high expectations for their children. The staff here at Eastfield are dedicated to developing a life-long love of learning for children who attend our school, within a safe, inclusive and stimulating environment. We will adapt to changing circumstances to provide and support both communal and individual learning, within the local community and the school. Through high expectations and encouragement, we will enable fulfilment and success. The commitments we will make to you as parent/carers and to the children who attend our school are as follows:

- Provide a safe environment for pupils in which adults are supportive and vigilant in all aspects of safeguarding.
- Ensure well-being threads strongly through our curriculum and experiences to support positive mental health within our school community.
- Establish strong relationships between and within home, school and the community.
- Provide a child centred approach to learning through a rich topicbased curriculum which excites children.
- Enable children to make links in their learning and support them to develop important skills to become life-long learners.
- Have high expectations of behaviour from all within our community through clear and consistent systems and communication.
- Ensure that our practise is of a consistently high standard that reflects changing circumstances through continued professional development and ongoing reflection.

# Clubs and activities...

Lunch clubs are organised purely within school and there isn't anything as parent/carers you need to do. We discuss with the children what clubs are available, they volunteer themselves for clubs they'd like to go to and then the staff running the clubs select the children who will attend their club for the half term period.

If your child has been selected to access one of the lunchtime clubs on offer, they will have already brought a slip home indicating which club that is and on which day they will be attending. All children accessing a lunch club will have their lunch in the hall first and then attend the club from 12:30pm onwards.

Providing that the clubs we are offering are sustainable and manageable, this selection process will be considered at the end of each half term throughout the whole of the academic year.

# Pupil Premium Funding

Pupil Premium represents additional funding that the government gives to schools for each pupil considered to be disadvantaged.

Poverty or low income is the single most important factor in predicting a child's future life chances, with many pupils in low income families having low attainment by age 16. The Government believes that the Pupil Premium is the best way to address these underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most.

If you are receiving any of the eligible benefits listed below, you can apply for free school meals and allow your school to receive the Pupil Premium funding.

Additionally, as part of the school registration process and our yearly data checks, you will also have the option to sign up for pupil premium.

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit but no element of Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC)) that does not exceed £16,190
- If you are supported under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after your employment finishes or after you start to work less hours per week
- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400 (as from 1 April 2018)

# Text "HEAR" to 85258

A new mental health free text messaging support service has launched in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough to help those who are struggling to cope.

Launched by NHS Cambridgeshire & Peterborough and in partnership with the national service <u>SHOUT</u>, the free to use text service HEAR 85258 provides real-time support to people of all ages who are struggling with their mental health.



When texting the word HEAR to 85258, the person will be connected to a trained volunteer who will take them from a place of crisis to a place of calm. During the confidential and anonymous conversation, the texter will be supported and signposted to local and national mental health services.

Texting HEAR to 85258 is free, discreet and runs 24/7. It won't appear on any bills and requires no app, data, password, or registration. It is available for anybody who lives, works, or studies in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.
