"Speak out. Stay safe." is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of ageappropriate a virtual assembly as well as supporting classroom-based activities which we have reviewed.

The content is delivered in an engaging and interactive way with the help of the NSPCC mascot "Buddy".
